

Deacon's Corner

Feast of Christ the King (B) - 2018

The feast of Christ the King not only venerates Jesus as Lord of Creation but as our Lord. It suggests that we evaluate what has dominion over our lives. We can be governed by goodwill for everyone, by openness, trust, kindness, compassion, and love. But we can also be dominated by hatred, suspicion of everyone, fear, guilt, unresolved anger, lack of forgiveness, and the like. Christ can rule over our lives or we can be ruled by a vain and arrogant ego.

Ask yourself some of these questions during your prayer time. Who, or what, has dominion over you? What "possesses" you? What drive or passion energizes your daily living? What personality traits do you exhibit most consistently? If you were to ask family members, friends, or co-workers for a character evaluation, how would they generally define you? For all our claims to be Christian, does Christ and his teachings dominate your attitudes in any observable way? Does love motivate your actions and guide your behavior?

Living authentically as a Christian requires that you be aware of what has taken dominion over you. For a fuller Christ-centered life remains impossible unless you are first conscious of what you have become.



XXXIV Domingo: "Seguir al Rey de la verdad.

¡Viva

Cristo Rey! La solemnidad de Cristo Rey, con la que termina el año litúrgico, nos invita a poner a Cristo en el primer lugar de nuestros intereses, de nuestro corazón. Y, en este año, la Iglesia nos propone el Evangelio en el que el Señor acepta el título de Rey, pero lo hace con una connotación especial: Él es el Rey de la verdad y sólo el que está en la verdad puede entenderle, escucharle, seguirle. El problema es que la verdad suele aparecer fraccionada: cada uno tiene su verdad y cada uno cree que su verdad es la auténtica e incluso la única. ¿Cómo hacer para no caer en un subjetivismo que nos haga estar engañados, viviendo en la mentira, mientras creemos estar con la verdad y con Cristo?. Sólo hay un camino seguro: escuchar y seguir al Cristo vivo, a la Iglesia. Así, pues, si la semana pasada meditábamos sobre la vida que trae la palabra de Dios, en comparación con algunas palabras "humanas", hoy debemos fijarnos en que esa palabra divina es también la que nos da la plenitud de la verdad y que gracias a eso se convierte en el camino más recto para llegar a la vida. Ahora bien, si en algún momento nuestros criterios éticos no coinciden con lo que Cristo nos enseña y la Iglesia nos recuerda, no pensemos que Cristo estaba equivocado porque vivió hace dos mil años, sino que los que estamos equivocados somos nosotros. Si queremos "estar en la verdad" debemos escuchar la voz del Maestro y someternos a ella, en lugar de pretender que sea el Señor el que se someta a nosotros, a nuestros intereses, a las modas o a los dictados de los poderosos de este mundo que buscan manipular las conciencias para su propio beneficio.
