Deacon's Corner

Journey with God

Today's readings help us to recall that we are all pilgrims on a journey in this life. Furthermore, our Second Reading from Paul's Letter to the Ephesians reminds us that as Christians, we are called to the high standard to "be imitators of God, as beloved children, and live in love, as Christ loved us and handed himself over for us as a sacrificial offering to God for a fragrant aroma." We are to live in the Holy Spirit, to be different from those who do not choose to follow Jesus. We are called to always seek and discover God in each other and in the world around us. But how?

Paul gives us a secret to living such a peaceful and loving life in Christ. He says we must remove from our lives "all bitterness, fury, anger, shouting," abusive criticism, and revenge. We must remove any desire for ill will or evil. We are to be kind and compassionate, forgiving each other as God has forgiven each of us. **THIS** is the journey to which we are called in this life. Our journey is not from point A to point B, but rather from a place where sin resides to a place where Christ dwells. Our journey is summed up in the prayer of St. Francis:

Where there is hatred, let me sow love; Where there is injury, pardon; Where there is doubt, faith; Where there is despair, hope; Where there is darkness, light; Where there is sadness, joy.

Our life is to be a journey of change, and this is a difficult journey to transform our world, one which requires great strength and stamina. But it is God himself who provides us the food and nourishment we need. Our Lord gives us his very Body and Blood to feed us and sustain us throughout the difficulties of this life as we strive to live lives of love. His Body is true food and his Blood is true drink. When we eat the Flesh of his Body in Holy Eucharist, we also receive the spiritual nourishment we need, the grace that comes only from him, to make us saints in our world. We are called to live as saints in this world, united with God, so that we may live united with him forever in eternity. In today's Gospel, Jesus says, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

So let us approach God today and throughout the week, knowing that he will give us what we need for the journey: his grace, his love, his forgiveness, and his wisdom. We do not need to rely on ourselves, but only on him.





XIX Domingo Ordinario: No critiques

Resulta verdaderamente dificil no criticar. De una forma o de otra, la mayoría lo hacemos, aunque la mayor parte de las veces las críticas sean leves y estén basadas en argumentos veraces. Cierto es que habría que distinguir las críticas verdaderamente dañinas de esas otras que son simples comentarios hechos con un poco de ligereza pero sin malicia. Pero incluso este tipo "ligth" de comentarios, cuando nos enteramos de que otros los han hecho de nosotros, nos hacen daño, con lo cual deberíamos suponer que también nosotros herimos a los demás cuando los hacemos. Criticar es, además, atribuirse funciones de juez, considerarse superiores a las personas criticadas y usurpar un poder que sólo Dios, que lo conoce todo, es capaz de detentar y ejecutar. Sólo el Señor es juez de las conciencias y nadie puede pretender usurpar ese puesto. Por eso Jesús nos enseña a no criticar, a darle al otro nuevas oportunidades, a poner excusas que justifiquen de algún modo –siempre dentro de lo posible- el comportamiento del otro. Sólo así podremos pedirle al Padre que sea comprensivo con nosotros mismos, pues le podremos decir a nuestro favor que nosotros hemos intentado ser comprensivos con nuestro prójimo.Por último, sería bueno aplicar aquel consejo de San Francisco, en el que pedía que no se dijera nada de nadie ausente que no se pudiera decir con caridad delante de él.
