

# Deacon's Corner

---

## *The Call to Love*

Today's Gospel message is challenging! The Good News calls us to be united with our Lord and Savior, and that in this unity, there is great joy, and that joy is seated in the very foundation of our relationship with him. Jesus calls us to be his friends and to share in his loving and sacrificial life. He chose us to be his friends, he chose us to live a life of love, and he chose us to bear good fruit in our world in his name. Jesus chose us to love him and love one another.

Thomas Gumbleton explains it this way: *God takes the initiative. God loves us. This is the message of the Gospel that once we grasp it, it can mean tremendous changes in our own lives in how we relate to God. But then, as Jesus says in the Gospel, it's also how we relate to one another, "This is my one commandment: That you love one another as I have loved you." Some people say at times, "Oh, that's making everything easy. What about the commandments? Don't do this. Don't do that. You must do this. You must do that."*

*No, it's not easy when you understand what Jesus is saying, "Love one another as I have loved you." Then, notice his example: "There is no greater love than this, than to lay down your life for another." No greater love than to lay down your life for those you love, which includes even your enemies. Don't just love those who love you, love your enemies. It does take great courage and conviction to understand that we really must love one another as Jesus loves us.*

We oftentimes become so task-oriented or driven by what we or others can and cannot do, that we completely forget that our calling is not one of rules and regulations, but one of right relationships. We must forge ahead, sacrificing our selfishness and our own will, so that in humility, we can allow the glory of God to shine through in our lives as we actively live the love of Christ in our day-to-day interactions with others, in our families and at work, with our friends, and with those who have hurt us or offended us in some way.

Let us look at our lives this week and find one place, one relationship, in need of greater love. Let's commit to building up the Body of Christ by daily sacrificing our own will for the will of our Savior. Let's spend a little special time this week with our friend Jesus, simply experiencing the joy of his presence in our lives as we express our gratitude for the immense love he has given us by his very life and through his Most Holy Church.

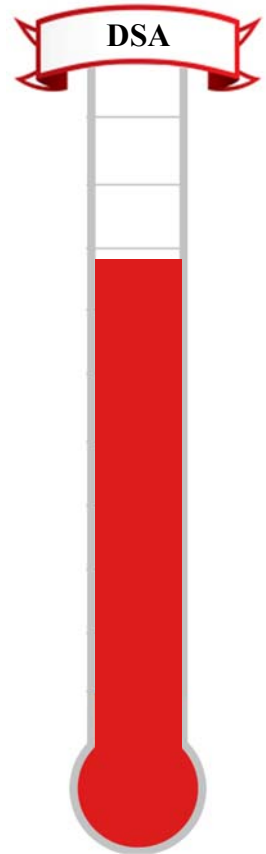

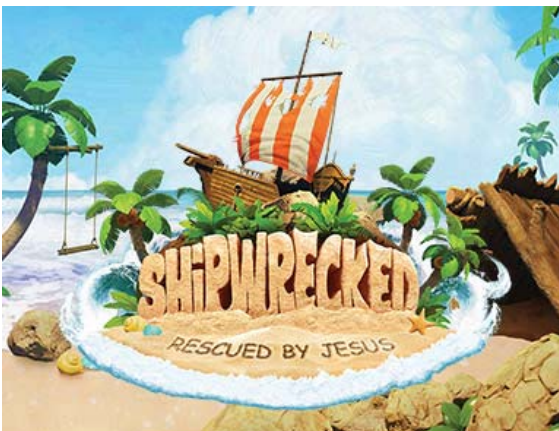
*Vacation Bible School will be June 25th-29th.*

## Actividades de la Comunidad Hispana

### **Sexto Domingo de Pascua: Vence el mal a fuerza del bien (Juan 15: 9– 17)**

Con frecuencia pensamos que Dios debe estar contento con nosotros porque no hacemos nada malo. Buscamos en nuestra conciencia y nos parece que hemos pasado por la vida casi sin pecados mortales. Debemos intentar no hacer nada malo, no cometer ningún tipo de pecado, especialmente los pecados mortales que rompen nuestra relación con Dios. Pero eso es insuficiente. Hay que ser consciente, y por lo tanto arrepentirse, de los pecados cometidos que de los actos de amor que no hemos hecho, de los llamados “pecados de omisión”, tan frecuentes como ignorados. Quizá ahí está la clave del comportamiento de los santos: ellos estaban enamorados de Cristo y aun haciendo tantas cosas por Él, todo les parecía insuficiente. Tenían tanto amor que sólo se consideraban contentos cuando daban la vida por el Ser amado, por Dios. Imitemos a los santos: no nos conformemos con no hacer el mal, aspiremos a hacer el bien, a darle a Dios todo lo que podamos, por amor a Él. Propósito: Evitar todo pecado mortal y, a la vez, no dejar escapar la oportunidad de obrar el bien, de ayudar a los demás, de suplir con nuestras obras buenas el mal cometido.
