Deacon's Corner

A Quaker pastor remembers the insight he learned from a woman who was part of the meeting he pastored: “This elderly woman had committed herself to the works of mercy. As I got to know her better, I was astounded at the many ways in which she had blessed hurting people. Though her income was modest, she lived simply so she could give generously. Though her many commitments kept her calendar full, she still found time to be present for those who needed comfort. The longer I knew her, the more I marveled at her charity, given the scarcity of her resources. Because of her humility, she was reluctant to talk with others about her own accomplishments. But one day she let slip the principle that guided her life, **‘little is much when God is in it.’**

“I have thought of that many times since, appreciating its truth more and more as the years pass. Little does become much when love is present. Love does magnify our works. Jesus knew this. He knew even the smallest gesture of love could transform the darkest situation and so fully commit himself to divine love that we are still awed by his life... We can be like him, and like all the God-bearers our world has known... We can be like him when we say yes to the Divine Presence that is also in us, as thoroughly as we are able. As we do that, our lives, and the lives of others, will be transformed. God’s joy will be in us, and our joy will be full.”

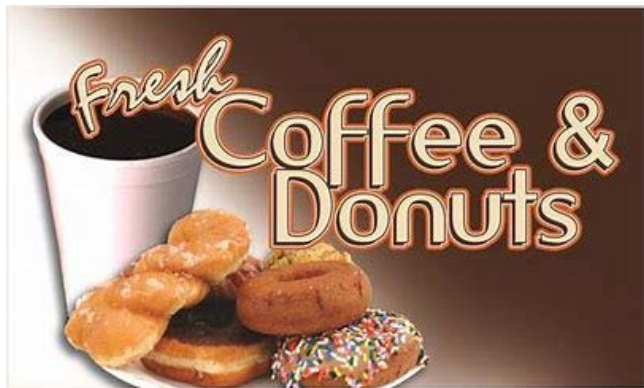

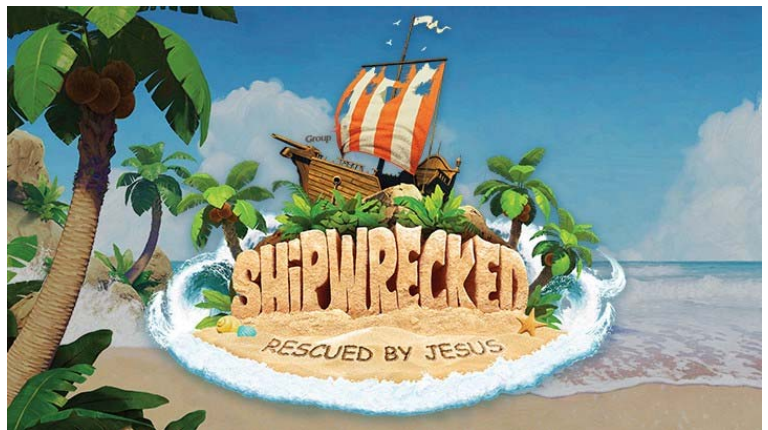


PREP News

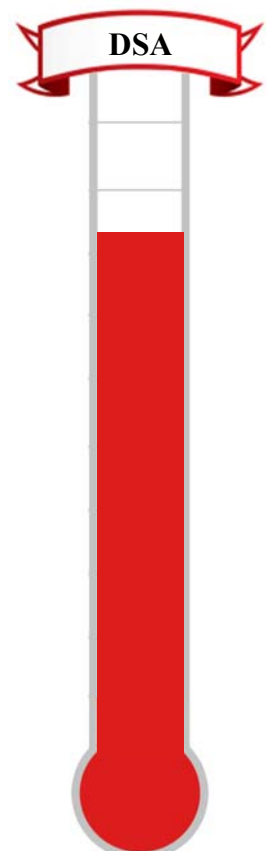

Actividades de la Comunidad Hispana

Trinidad: Unidad, Pluralidad y siempre Caridad

El dogma de la Santísima Trinidad nos enseña una verdad que conocemos porque nos ha sido revelada por Jesús, pues sin su ayuda jamás habríamos podido acceder a ella. Nos habla de la intimidad de Dios: Hay una sola naturaleza divina, un solo Dios, pero existen tres personas distintas -Padre, Hijo y Espíritu- iguales en dignidad y que participan de esa única naturaleza. Además, el dogma de la Trinidad nos recuerda cómo es la vida que se lleva en el Cielo. Las tres divinas personas son una, en el sentido de que participan de la común naturaleza. A la vez, son diferentes, pues cada una es ella misma, persona distinta a las otras dos. Es un misterio, ciertamente, pero un misterio enriquecedor porque nos enseña cómo tenemos que intentar vivir en la tierra: respetando las diferencias que existen en los demás y a la vez buscando la unidad, buscando la caridad y el amor recíproco. Por lo tanto, a imitación de la Santísima Trinidad, déjale al otro que sea él mismo, no intentes que sea una copia tuya. Respétale en aquello que tiene legítimo derecho a ser o a hacer, aunque no sea lo que tú harías, porque él no tiene por qué ser como tú, pensar como tú o vivir como tú. Además, el hecho de que sea diferente a ti es bueno para ti, pues te enriquece, te complementa. Sin embargo, este respeto a las legítimas diferencias hay que compensarlo con una búsqueda intensa y sincera de la unidad.
