Deacon's Corner

Stand, Walk, & Kneel with Christ

Today we celebrate the Great Solemnity of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of Christ. It may seem odd, especially to one who is unfamiliar with our faith, that we rejoice and “celebrate” this day as we do. But the way we celebrate this day also speaks loudly about our faith and specifically reminds us of certain aspects of what we say we believe.

In his wonderful book, “God is Near Us,” Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger provides a clear and comprehensive understanding of this day by focusing on certain key actions in which we participate today. Cardinal Ratzinger tells us that there are three distinctive components that are involved in today’s celebration, three actions that we do that point to a deeper meaning in our spiritual lives:

*First there is what we are doing right now, meeting together around the Lord, **standing before the Lord**, for the Lord, and thus standing side by side together. Next there is **walking with the Lord**, the procession. And finally there is the heart and the climax of it, **kneeling before the Lord**, the adoration, glorifying him and rejoicing in his presence. Standing before the Lord, walking with the Lord, and kneeling before the Lord, these three therefore are the constituent elements of this day.*

He goes on to say that as we **stand** before the Lord, we do so as a community, as we publicly proclaim our unity, our oneness, our gathering as the Body of Christ, and the universal call for ALL people to be drawn into this love. We receive the one Body of Christ and enter into the one Heart of Christ, and this is the foundation of our unity in faith. This is a public proclamation, not some private club – our membership consists of the good, the bad, and the ugly and we are to welcome others with the love and mercy of God. We are truly one in the Lord through our Savior Jesus Christ.

As we **walk** in procession, we walk with each other as we follow the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. Ratzinger writes, “The Lord who has become our bread is thus showing us the way, is in fact our way, as he leads us.” It is our way of outwardly demonstrating that we are not aimlessly wandering through this life, but that we are purposefully following our Lord, who feeds us as both Word and Bread. And we follow our Lord to the Eternal Life of Heaven, the gift of his Promise, the reward of the New Covenant which began when he willingly gave his Body and Blood for our salvation. We are Christians because we walk with and follow Christ, our Good Shepherd.

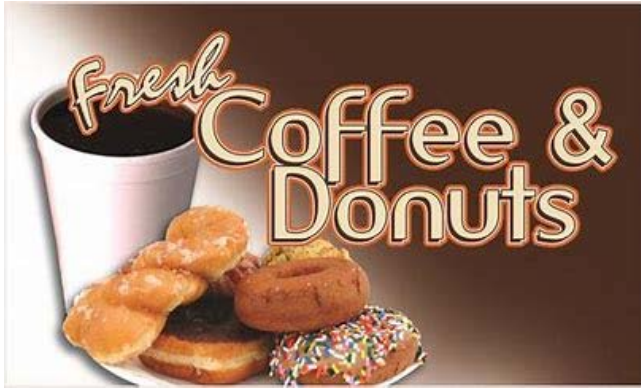
To **kneel** before the Eucharist demonstrates our belief in the Real Presence of Christ, as we adore, worship, and give glory God our Father. Jesus humbled himself, becoming a man, and offered himself as the sacrifice for humanity. We, who are sinners, see the sinless and perfect Jesus bowed down from his throne of love and mercy, and so we bow down before him in adoration, love, and humility, thankful for his incredible and infinite love and mercy.

Let’s take time today and throughout the week to examine our lives. Let’s commit to stand in unity, as Christians of faith, publicly living out lives of the faith we profess. Let’s walk with our Lord, following him and allowing him to lead us each day. Let’s adore Christ as we recognize his presence in others, and may everything we do be for God’s glory. God bless.

First aid kit and personal hygiene—toilet paper and hand sanitizer.
Portable radio, flashlight, clock— Cell phone (fully CHARGED) - Extra batteries.
Baby food, diapers, formula, etc.
Bottled water for drinking (1 gallon/person/day)—fill your bathtub before the storm hits for washing.
Pillows, blanket, sleeping bags, extra clothes.
Food supplies that do not require preparation—remember can opener—Don't forget your pet food.
Mosquito repellant, disposable plates, cups, utensils, trash bags, dried fruit, nuts, crackers.
Tools, nails, duct tape—gasoline—fill your cars.

Corpus Christi: Amar a quien tanto nos ha amado

Cristo, llegado el momento de la despedida, quiso dejarnos un extraordinario regalo: se entregó a sí mismo de una manera –en la Eucaristía- poco antes de entregarse de otra –en la Cruz-. Todo era amor. Por la Eucaristía se quedaba para salvarnos en la cotidianidad de la comunión. Por la Cruz se iba para lavar nuestros pecados con su sangre redentora. Eucaristía y Cruz son dos manifestaciones de la misma realidad: el amor de Cristo a los hombres, una auténtica “locura de amor”. Si Cristo se ha quedado para consolarnos, acudamos nosotros a comulgar y a orar ante el Sagrario para consolarle. Si Él es nuestro apoyo, nuestro alimento, seamos nosotros su alegría. No debería pasar un solo día –si pudiéramos hacerlo- sin ir a misa o sin ir a hacer una visita ante el Santísimo. ¿Por qué acudir sólo cuando tenemos una enfermedad o un problema? ¿Por qué no ir sólo para dar las gracias? ¿Por qué no ir a visitar al Señor por el mero hecho de hacerle compañía? ¿Por qué no ser para los demás el pan de la caridad como Cristo lo es para nosotros? ¿No será que, en el fondo, no creemos que Cristo no está en la Eucaristía?. O eso o es que somos unos egoístas incorregibles. Recordemos, “amor con amor se paga”. Propósito: Ir a comulgar bien preparados, siempre que sea posible. Ir a visitar al Santísimo para agradecer y acompañar. Convertirnos en pan que se da a los demás a través de la caridad.
