The Health and Wellness Ministry Presents Seven Steps to Ethical Decision Making

Step 1: **Define the problem** - First, explore the difference between what you expect and/or desire and the current reality. By defining the problem in terms of outcomes, you can clearly state the problem.

Step 2: Seek out relevant assistance, guidance and support -Resources can include people (i.e., a mentor, coworkers, external colleagues, or friends and family) as well professional guidelines and organizational policies and codes..

Step 3: **Identify alternatives** – Don't limit yourself to obvious alternatives. Be open to new and better alternatives.

Step 4: **Evaluate the alternatives** You should think through not just what results each alternative could yield, but the likelihood it is that such impact will occur., keep in mind that the more the evaluation is fact-based, the more confident you can be that the expected outcome will occur

Step 5: **Make the decision** a clear list of the alternatives that were considered and a clear rationale for the proposed solution.

Step 6: **Implement the decision** - The action itself is the first real, tangible step in changing the situation.. A decision only counts when it is implemented.

Step 7: **Evaluate the decision** The final test of any decision is whether or not the problem was fixed. Did it go away? Did it change appreciably? Is it better now, or worse, or the same? What new problems did the solution create?



IV Domingo Ordinario: Aceptar las críticas

A Jesús intentaron matarle nada menos que en Nazaret. Habría sido aún más trágico de lo que resultó después su muerte en Jerusalén, que hubieran sido sus propios paisanos los que acabaran con Él. Ellos, con los que había jugado siendo niño y a los que, sin duda, tantos favores había hecho, estuvieron a punto de asesinarle. ¿Y por qué? Primero, por envidia, pues no se perdona a alguien que triunfa. Segundo, porque Él no hizo allí los milagros que ellos esperaban y que en el fondo se resumían en una sola cosa: verter a manos llenas la salud y la fortuna sobre sus vecinos. Tercero, porque Cristo se atrevió a lanzarles alguna crítica. También nosotros solemos actuar así: la envidia nos lleva a despreciar al prójimo y a sentirnos molestos con su éxito y alegres con su fracaso. Además, cuando el otro no nos da lo que queremos, nos olvidamos de lo que ya nos ha dado y nos alejamos de él. Y en cuanto a las críticas: la reacción de la mayoría es la de acallar la voz que nos dice lo que no nos gusta oír, tanto si tiene razón como si no la tiene, tanto si nos está diciendo las cosas en el momento oportuno y del mejor modo posible como si aún teniendo razón ha perdido los modos. Hagamos, pues, un esfuerzo de objetividad, para encajar las correcciones, seleccionando de ellas lo que nuestra conciencia nos dice que es verdadero, aunque nos cueste reconocerlo.
