Deacon's Corner

In today's Gospel we find Jesus alone and at prayer. He sends the disciples away to precede him in their boat to the other side of the lake.

How did Jesus pray? He prayed that he would be and do all that the Father wished. I don't believe Jesus needed a lot of words in moments like this. I think he prayed in the Spirit of love and faith by surrendering himself completely to the will of his Father. Certainly, there were times of prayer when Jesus used words; times when he was broken and reached out for help and consolation. But at this moment, when he was alone, all he wanted was to be with his Father, simply to enjoy the peace, joy and love of being in communion with the One who loved him eternally.

This prayer of the heart, this wordless simple prayer of love, is one for us to imitate. For the same Spirit of love who prayed in Jesus is the Spirit we have received and who prays in us. What could be more powerful and meaningful for us than to be totally present to our God so that God can just hold us and speak to us?

We tend to use more words than we have to. The child in the arms of their parent, lovers in an embrace or sitting next to each other holding hands don't need words. Sometimes words are an obstacle that separates rather than unites us.

We don't make God present by many and beautiful prayers; God is present in us always. This prayer of the heart is a prayer in which by our presence, faith, love, and silence we allow ourselves to be totally present to our God. It is in this kind of prayer that the Lord does great and wonderful things in us.

Spend some quiet time with our God in the Adoration Chapel or any peaceful place you choose.

Father Andy Rudnicki, Pastor



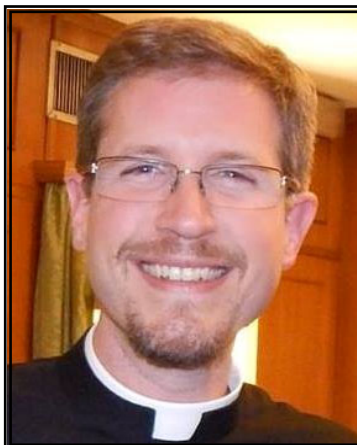
Fr. Andy is originally from Goniadz, Poland where his mother, sisters and most of his family still lives. At the age of 19 he entered the Congregation of Marians of the Immaculate Conception in Poland. He received his education at the University of Lublin in Poland with a Masters of Moral Theology. After his ordination on June 3, 1990, he became assistant director in the area of vocations and a year later was appointed director. In 1993 he began parish work in Warsaw and was the director of parish youth ministry. He came to our diocese in 1998 and has worked at many different parishes, including Holy Name of Jesus, Ascension, St. Anastasia and Holy Redeemer, as well as OLQA back in 2000. Fr. Andy speaks English, Polish, Latin, Russian and Italian and also knows Braille. He has traveled to many different countries but his favorite place to travel to will always be Poland. Fr. Andy became the pastor of Our Lady Queen of the Apostles on February 1, 2006.

Father Laurent Assenga, ALCP, Parochial Vicar



Fr. Laurent was born in Rombo, Tanzania. He belongs to the Religious Community of The Apostolic Life Community of Priests (ALCP). On December 13, 1985 he was ordained a deacon and on June 26, 1986 he was ordained to the priesthood at Sabuko Parish in the Moshi Diocese. 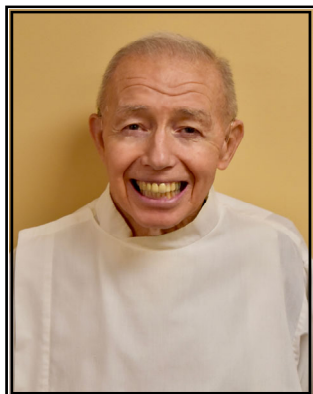
Father Brian Campbell, Parochial Vicar

Deacon Stephen Hayes



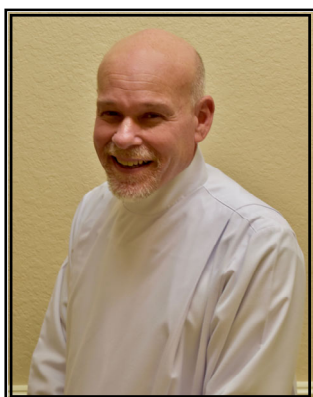

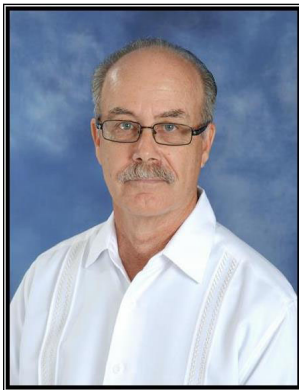
Ryan Winters, Daytime Maintenance

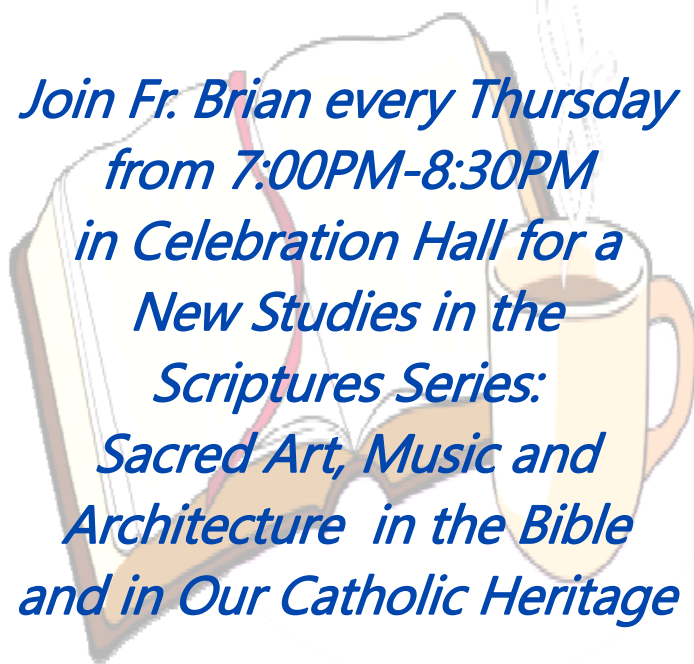
