Deacon's Corner

They Stood in Amazement

Today we hear the great readings of the Day of Pentecost, the Birthday of the Church, the day when the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples as “tongues of fire.” The Holy Spirit, the promised comforter of Jesus, and the Third Person of the Most Holy Trinity is sent by God to be with the disciples and the Church. We hear that this Spirit of Truth allows the disciples to give praise to God in many different languages that can be clearly understood by those visiting Jerusalem from various parts of the world.

This was a moment of true glory for God. Our Scripture tells us the “many *prominent* Jews” had gathered in Jerusalem from all over the known world. It was the time of the celebration known as the Festival of Weeks. This festival commemorated the giving of the Old Testament Law to the Jewish people on Mt. Sinai, so many devout and holy Jews from around the world would pilgrimage to Jerusalem for this festival.

When the devout and prominent Jews of Judea express their shock upon hearing the disciples praising God in various languages, scripture says, “They were astounded, and in amazement they asked, ‘Are not all these people who are speaking Galileans?’” The fact that they were speaking in many different languages didn’t seem to matter as much as the fact that they were from Galilee. Why?

The Galileans were considered the “low class” of Jews. They certainly weren’t the “prominent” Jews of their time. They had funny accents, were less well-educated, weren’t quite as holy as the Jews of Judea, were less sophisticated in their clothing and manners, and were oftentimes seen as “country bumpkins.” The southern Judeans did not respect the Galileans from the north, and their “astonishment” seems to be more about the fact that God is initiating a New Covenant with these lower-class people. Such a great and incredible spiritual and historical event was happening. The New Covenant had begun. God had revealed himself to the world with a New Law, a Law of Love that is written on our hearts. The Spirit and Glory of God was on display for everyone to see. Yet God used the simple, unsophisticated, “lower class,” less educated, “less holy,” to bring about his New Kingdom! *That’s* why they were amazed.

God was working in and through those whom society would never see as worthy. God chose the lowly so that his power and strength can be magnified. God chose the uneducated and unsophisticated to demonstrate his infinite Truth and Beauty. Today is a reminder of how and who God chooses, that Jesus chose the “country bumpkins” of his time to launch his Kingdom, to give the world a New Law, and to give birth to his Church, revealing the power of the Holy Spirit. Perhaps it was because of their “blue collar” simplicity that the disciples were able to look upon a man like them, a simple carpenter, and see the Son of God – a faith of simplicity, but a faith of deep strength.

In fact, only eleven of the disciples were from Galilee. They were the faithful ones, the ones upon whom our Church is built, the ones who persevered in sweat and blood, empowered by the Holy Spirit. They had the strength of character that endured so much, but also brought incredible rewards. There was only one disciple from the more sophisticated area of Judea. He was the betrayer of Christ, Judas Iscariot.

Let us pray this week for a “blue collar” faith, a faith that is real and raw, a faith that is ready to work in the dirt of our lives, a faith strengthened by the Holy Spirit that empowers us each day, to boldly proclaim and live out the Love of Christ. May the Holy Spirit rest on us and set us on fire for our Lord.

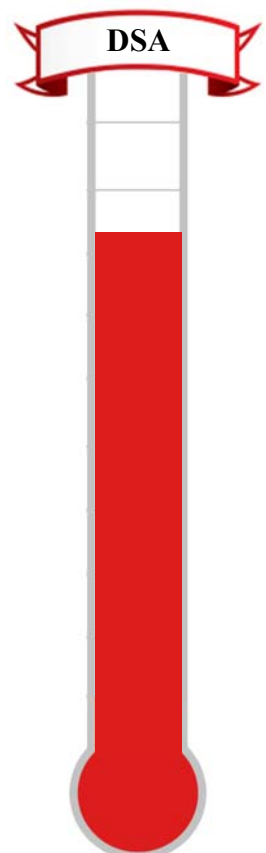
