Deacon's Corner

Which is the Greatest Commandment?

When Jesus was asked which of the Commandments is the greatest, the Pharisees weren't merely speaking about the Ten Commandments. There are 613 designated commandments from the Jewish Law, and the Pharisees were testing Jesus by trying to get him to pick just one. Everyone knew all of the law was equally important, but Jesus brings his infinite Wisdom to play when he answers that the greatest commandment is love.

Jesus says, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments." Precisely because Jesus himself is love, he is also the fulfillment of the law and prophets. But what does this *love* mean? What does this love look like?

There are so many variations and ways in which we use the word *love*. We say, "I love my job," or "I love my new car," or "I love this movie." Most of the time we use the word *love* to express a positive feeling we get from something, someone, or a particular situation. The love of which Jesus speaks, however, is not about getting, but rather, of giving.

To love God is to give ourselves to God, and to act according to his Holy Will. We may indeed receive good feelings from doing God's will, but the act of love is in uniting our will with his.

To love our neighbor is to give to them what is ours. It may be that we give our time to talk with a friend about a difficult situation they're going through, to give our money to assist those suffering from a natural disaster, or to give up some desires we have so that another can get what they want. Loving our neighbor means acting for what's best for them, not necessarily us. It means putting others before ourselves – sacrifice, in a word.

Loving our neighbor naturally flows from loving God. The two go hand-in-hand, and the image of perfect love, the Cross of Christ, should always be our guide. As we grow in our loving relationship with God and become more conformed to Christ, it will become easier to imitate him by laying down our lives for each other and putting the good of others first.

Lord, help me to know and do your will, so that I may love my neighbor as myself and always seek the good of others. Amen.
