

# Deacon's Corner

#### We Have Been Called. We Are Sent.

Today's Gospel challenges us to live our lives as true disciples of Christ. We hear that Jesus calls his disciples and then sends them out "two-by-two." Jesus emphasizes the community nature by which we are to live as believers. We are not called to live in isolation. We are not called to have a relationship with God that's just "me and God." Our personal relationship with Jesus is within the community of believers, and so we worship, pray, and live sacramental lives within the family of Jesus. Living with others gives us opportunities to show love, mercy, kindness, forgiveness, fellowship, and joy by challenging our own selfishness and ego. As a family of believers, what we say is tested by what we do. Do we live out the Gospel we say we believe? Is the faith we profess with our lips alive in our actions with each other?

Jesus also sends forth his disciples telling them to take nothing except a walking stick and sandals. They are not to take any food, money, extra clothing, or any other stuff. Jesus is sending his disciples into the world free of its material things. They are to pack lightly. Jesus doesn't want us to be bogged down in the things of this world, but to be free to respond to the charity of others and to accept hospitality and care with kindness and blessing. Do we have a hard time focusing on others because we are too preoccupied or worried about our material possessions? Does our pursuit of "stuff" interfere with our ability to be loving and generous to others, to share the Gospel message with them, or to be present and engaged in their lives?

Each celebration of the Mass ends with the words, "Go in peace," "Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord," or similar words. The point is that **WE** who have been called by Jesus are also being sent by him into the world. We are each to go into the world, as members of the community of believers and family of God, to bring the Gospel of Love to everyone through our words and actions. We, who receive Jesus in the Sacrament of Holy Communion, are to take him and his message to our families, friends, co-workers, and community. This isn't an option in the Christian life; it is its purpose and lifeblood.

So, let us examine our lives this week and realign ourselves to be true disciples, apostles who live the Gospel as we have been called and sent by our Lord, Jesus Christ. We are to be a community of individual believers, not motivated by this earthly life, which is passing. We are to be a community of faith-driven believers, who demonstrate our hope in eternal life through our daily practice of true Christian love in humility. May each of us accept the call of Jesus to be sent into our world and to transform it for his greater glory.



Water: How much should you drink every day?

How much water should you drink each day? It's a simple question with no easy answer. Simple rule is to drink daily 1/3 your weight in ounces plus another 50%.

Studies have produced varying recommendations over the years. Your individual water needs depend on many factors, including your health, how active you are and where you live.

No single formula fits everyone. Knowing more about your body's need for fluids will help you estimate how much water to drink each day.

Lack of water can lead to *dehydration* — a condition


that occurs when you don't have enough water in your body to carry out normal functions. Even mild dehydration can drain your energy and make you tired and give you a headache.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As Saint John Paul II so beautifully taught in his *Theology of the Body*, married love is most authentically lived when it is free, total, faithful and fruitful. In this way, married love most closely images Christ's love for his bride, the Church. Pope Francis reminds us in his Apostolic Exhortation, *The Joy of Love*, that this call to fruitfulness is a sign of love which always gives life (no. 165).

In support of this call to married fruitfulness, the Church proposes Natural Family Planning (NFP) as a modern, scientific method available to couples for planning their families by enabling them to participate in God's creative action without breaking the inseparable link between the unitive and procreative meanings of the conjugal (marital) act. Couples learn how to identify and interpret the natural and observable signs of the wife's fertility cycle. As NFP becomes a way of life, the couple cooperates with each other and God in exercising the duties of responsible parenthood through mutual trust and communication between themselves and God.

Each July, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) sponsors an educational campaign to encourage and support couples in the use of NFP. This year, NFP Awareness Week encompasses the 50th anniversary of Pope Paul VI's Papal Encyclical, Humanae Vitae, which boldly articulates time honored Catholic beliefs about human sexuality. This year, NFP Awareness Week is celebrated from July 22 through July 28 with the theme: Generations of Love (Humanae Vitae 1968-2018): Celebrate God's Gift of Married Love!

In his *Humanae Vitae* Encyclical, Pope Paul VI prophetically articulates the grave consequences of the use of artificial and illicit means of birth control which include a general lowering of morality, increased infidelity, and devaluing of women (*HV*, no. 17). One only needs to scan today's headlines to confirm the devastating accuracy of his predictions and discern the destructive consequences for families. In contrast, couples who practice NFP enjoy greater marital stability and experience divorce at only one-tenth the rate of divorce among first time marriages.

During NFP Awareness Week, I would like to thank those married couples who live out their marriage commitment to free, total, faithful and fruitful love. I encourage all married couples and those preparing for marriage to reflect on their current or future marriages and how they can authentically and responsibly fulfill their commitment to fruitful love. #### Evangeliza aunque no te sientas preparado

Es corriente oír que as acerca de lo que cuesta hacer apostolado, de la vergüenza que hay que pasar cuando se tiene que defender a la Iglesia en el ambiente laboral o incluso en el familiar. Además, por ser cristiano pareces ser reo de todos los delitos imaginables, de todas las culpas que el resto de los cristianos hayan cometido en la historia (Inquisición, Cruzadas...), reales, inventadas o exageradas. Conviene fijarse, precisamente por esas similitudes, en lo que hicieron los primeros cristianos. Ellos no lo tenían más fácil, ya que incluso se jugaban la vida. Sin embargo tuvieron el valor de enfrentarse con un medio hostil y vencieron. Las diferencias entre ellos y nosotros no están, quizá, en las dificultades del ambiente, ni en que ellos tenían más medios materiales para evangelizar, sino en que tenían más fe, más amor a Cristo, más convencimiento de que ser cristiano era una gran suerte. Por eso, aunque tenemos que intentar tener mejores estructuras evangelizadoras – como medios de comunicación-, lo que debemos hacer sobre todo es tener más medios espirituales, más oración, más y mejor testimonio de vida.
