Deacon's Corner

Sometime, as a prayer, do this: Take a compass and draw a perfect circle. The center of the circle - the place where you pricked the paper to insert the compass point - is the same distance from any point on the circumference. Perfect.

Imagine that the circle you drew is the world and everyone in it, and that God is the center. Mark a point somewhere on the circle and write your name. Now mark another point on the circle and write the name of someone dear to you. At a third point on the circle, write the name of someone you're not fond of. Now draw a straight line from each of the points to the center point - the point that is God. As each line moves closer to God, you will see that each line moves closer to the others - until, in God, they meet. As we move towards God, we move closer to one another - and as we move away from one another, we move away from God.

Jesus' image of the vine and branches reminds us that because we are one in Christ, we are one in one another - as a family and as a church. We are connected to one another, we belong to one another, we are branches of the same vine planted by God the vinegrower - we are all points on the same circle, making our way to God. In Christ, we are sustained in God's grace throughout time and space; despite our different races and creeds, our nationalities and cultures, we are branches that draw life from the same root. We should consider praying the "circle" during this Easter Season to realize the Risen Jesus' vision of a community that cherishes its unity in God's compassion and our common identity as his sons and daughters.

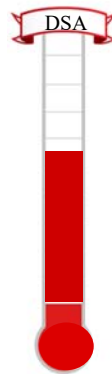

Actividades de la Comunidad Hispana

Quinto Domingo de Pascua (Juan 15: 1-8)

El Señor nos advierte, en el Evangelio de este domingo, que es imposible dar fruto si no se está unido a Él. Pero también nos dice que para dar fruto utiliza algo tan doloroso como la poda. Porque, no hay que olvidarlo, toda poda duele. El primer mensaje es que necesitamos aumentar nuestra relación con el Señor si queremos fructificar, si queremos evangelizar, si queremos ayudar a los demás; la oración, la confesión y la comunión frecuentes se convierten, por lo tanto, en instrumentos imprescindibles para hacer el bien, para mediar por los que están sufriendo, para consolar, para conseguir el milagro de mover los más duros corazones, porque nos van a permitir estar con contacto con la fuente, con Cristo. El segundo mensaje es que el sufrimiento podemos convertirlo en material para la evangelización, para el testimonio, para “dar fruto”. Sin embargo, cuando lo vivimos unidos a Dios y sin desesperar, nos convertimos en testigos creíbles que atraen y que son capaces de llevar a las personas hacia Dios. Propósito: Aumentar la oración y la motivación religiosa al hacer las cosas, el “por ti” dirigido al Señor. Cuando sufrimos, nos convertimos en testigos de que se puede ser feliz en el dolor.
