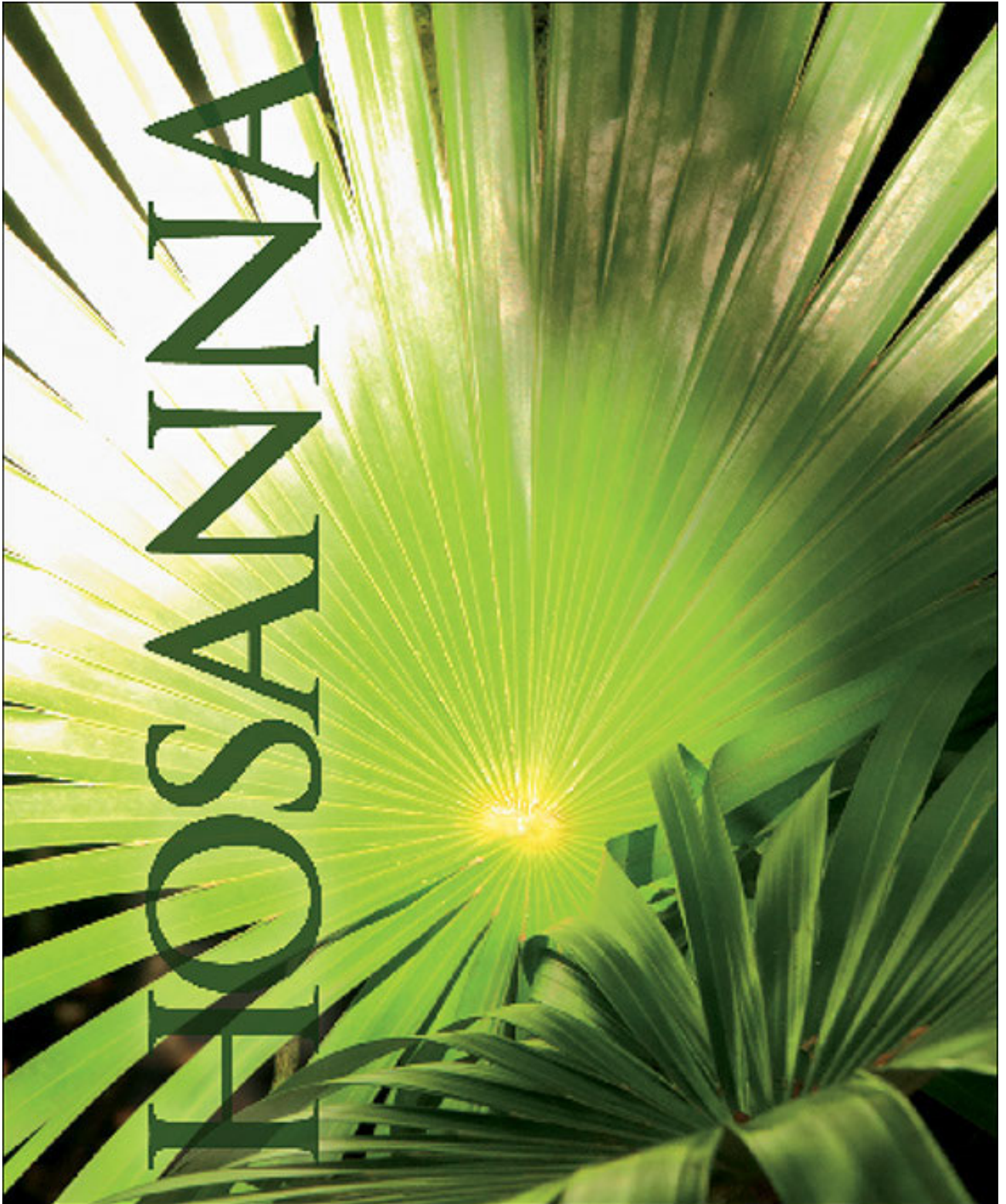

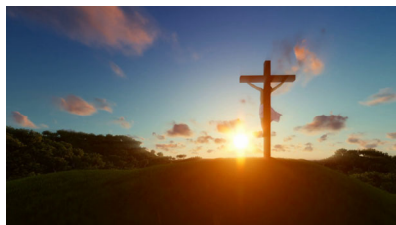

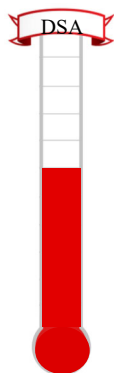


New Parishioner Tour and Luncheon!

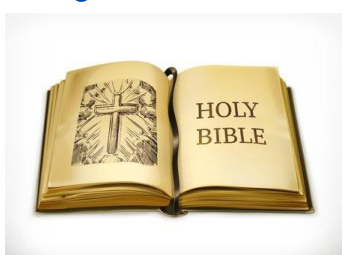

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

For 800 years the Franciscans have ministered to the faithful in the Holy Land as well as living in and caring for the places where Jesus and His Blessed Mother lived and walked. A blessed tradition for most pilgrims is to walk the Via Dolorosa on Good Friday. On Friday, April 19, many will commemorate the *Via Crucis*, Christ's Way of the Cross, and take part in Passion services at their local parish.

The wars, unrest and instability in and around the Holy Land have been especially hard on Christians. Catequesis del Papa Francisco sobre la Eucaristía: la misa nos ayuda a amar al prójimo

Por tradición bíblica los judíos reposan el sábado, mientras que en la sociedad romana no estaba previsto un día semanal de abstinencia de los trabajos serviles. Fue el sentido cristiano de vivir como hijos y no como esclavos, animado por la eucaristía, el que hizo del domingo, el día de reposo. Sin Cristo estamos condenados a estar dominados por el cansancio de lo cotidiano, con sus preocupaciones y por el miedo al mañana. El encuentro dominical con el Señor nos da la fuerza para vivir el hoy con confianza y coraje y para ir adelante con esperanza. Por eso, nosotros cristianos vamos a encontrar al Señor el domingo en la celebración eucarística. La comunión eucarística con Jesús, Resucitado y Vivo para siempre, anticipa el domingo sin atardecer, cuando ya no haya fatiga ni dolor, ni luto, ni lágrimas sino solo la alegría de vivir plenamente y para siempre con el Señor. También de este bendito reposo nos habla la misa del domingo, enseñándonos, en el fluir de la semana, a confiarnos a las manos del Padre que está en los cielos. ¿Por qué ir a misa el domingo? No vamos a misa para dar algo a Dios, sino para recibir de Él aquello de lo que realmente tenemos necesidad. No es suficiente responder que es un precepto de la Iglesia; esto ayuda a preservar su valor. Nosotros cristianos tenemos necesidad de participar en la misa dominical porque solo con la gracia de Jesús, con su presencia viva en nosotros y entre nosotros, podemos poner en práctica su mandamiento y así ser sus testigos creíbles.
