Deacon's Corner

Unity – Forgiveness & Mercy - Peace

Since the beginning of the Church's celebration of the Eucharist, our liturgy has maintained a certain order of prayers and actions that lead up to reception of the Most Holy Body and Precious Blood of Jesus. After consecration, when the priest, as the person of Christ, pronounces the words which change simple bread and wine into Christ's Body and Blood, the prayer sequence ends with these words: "Through Him, with Him, and in Him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours Almighty Father, forever and ever." All of us gathered then acclaim our belief in this call to unity, this call for God's glory, by answering with a great "Amen."

We acknowledge that God is our source of unity, and we are particularly united together as the Body of Christ, the Bride of Christ, his Holy Church. As a church united, we then pray the Our Father. With hands and hearts joined, we pray that our will and God's will become one. We ask God to be merciful to us and keep us from temptation. And we beg God to forgive us of our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. It is through our unity in Christ that God's mercy and forgiveness become effective. We have been crucified with Christ and we have died with him in Holy Baptism. Just as Jesus was raised from the dead, we also hope to be resurrected on the last day to eternal life. This is possible, however, only because of his mercy, *his Divine Mercy*.

It is precisely by living in unity with Christ and his Divine Mercy, that we are able to bring peace to our world. It starts in the simplest of relationships, and that is why we then offer one another the Sign of Peace. Once we are able to live as a people united in God as brothers and sisters, and accept his love, mercy, and forgiveness, we are then able, for God's glory, to take that love, mercy, and forgiveness to others. We are called to not merely say the words, "Peace be with you," but we are called to give that peace to each other, and we do that through mercy and forgiveness that allows us to be true brothers and sisters in our Lord.

Let us listen to today's readings, and take time to examine our lives to see where we can offer the forgiveness and mercy that Jesus offers us. Once we are able to do so, we will experience the Peace of Christ and will then be able to give that peace to others, becoming one in spirit, becoming one in the Body of Christ.

a veces difícil, de confesar los pecados; siempre es un regalo de Dios y como tal hay que recibirlo y agradecerlo. Pero también la contemplación de la misericordia divina debe llevarnos a la imitación. Tengamos misericordia como Dios tiene misericordia de nosotros. Perdonemos como necesitamos ser perdonados. Ayudemos al prójimo como nos gustaría que nos ayudaran o como el propio Cristo nos ha ayudado. Seamos nosotros el instrumento que Dios usa para impartir su misericordia.**Propósito:** Agradecer la misericordia divina recibiéndola en la confesión. Dar misericordia, con todos los matices de la caridad, como instrumentos de la misericordia de Dios.
